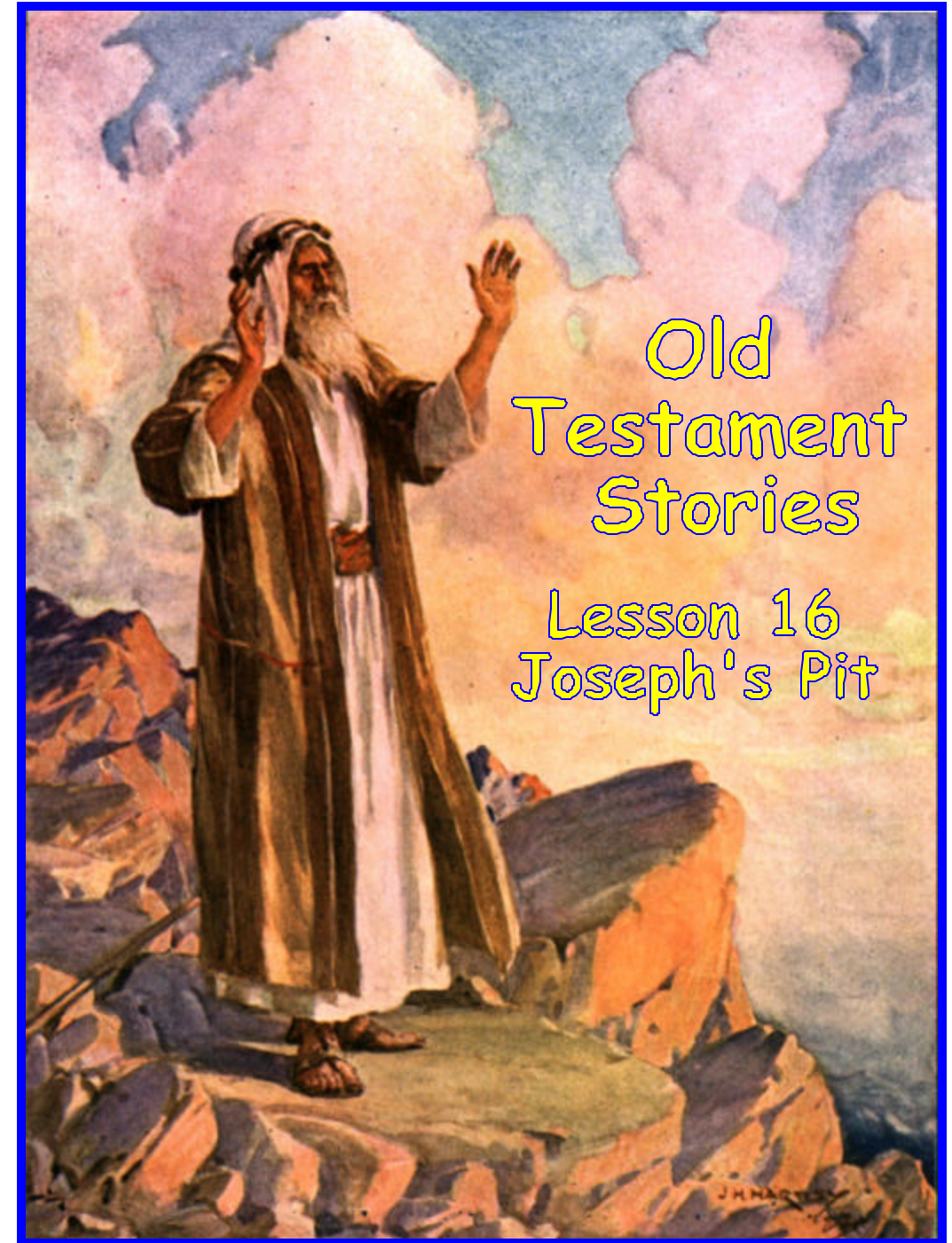
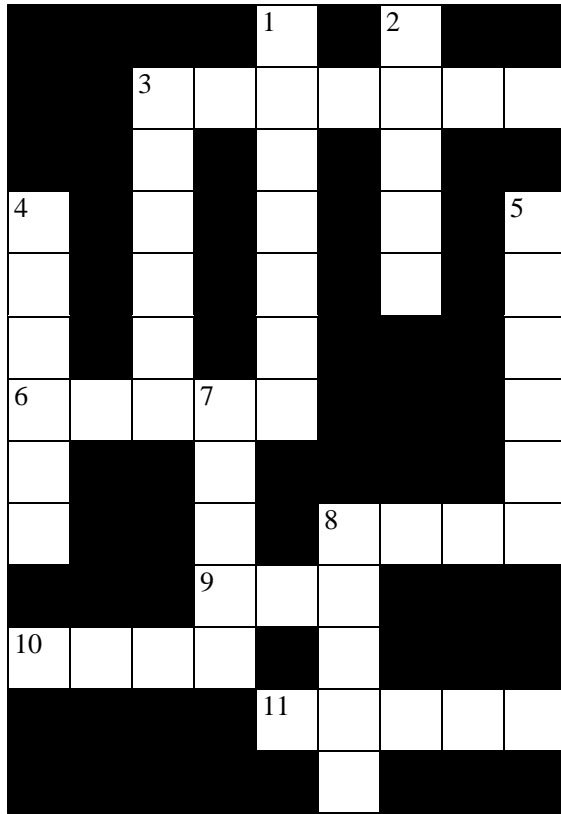

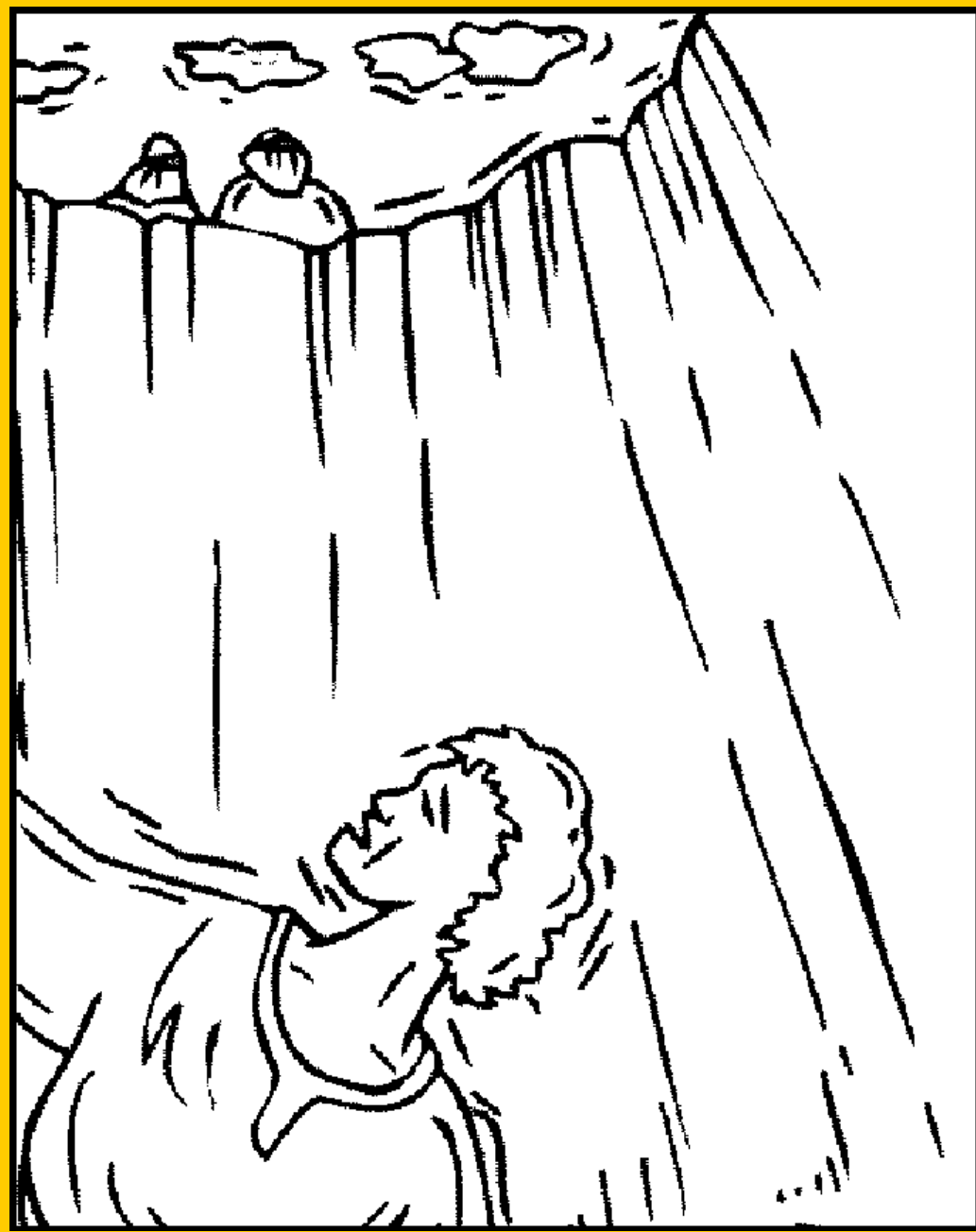

## Genesis 37:1-28



And Jacob dwelt in the land wherein his father was a stranger, in the land of Canaan. 2 These are the generations of Jacob. Shall I and thy mother and thy brethren indeed come to bow down ourselves to thee to the earth? 11 And his brethren envied him; but his father observed the saying.

And his brethren were content. 28 Then there passed by Midianites merchantmen; and they drew and lifted up Joseph out of the pit, and sold Joseph to the Ishmeelites for twenty pieces of silver: and they brought Joseph into Egypt.

## Joseph Sold into Slavery



**Dreams** - God has frequently made use of dreams in communicating his will to men. The most remarkable instances of this are recorded in the history of Jacob (Gen. 28:12; 31:10), Laban (31:24), Joseph (37:9-11), Gideon (Judg. 7), and Solomon (1 Kings 3:5). Other significant dreams are also recorded, such as those of Abimelech (Gen. 20:3-7), Pharaoh's chief butler and baker (40:5), Pharaoh (41:1-8), the Midianites (Judg. 7:13), Nebuchadnezzar (Dan. 2:1; 4:10, 18), the wise men from the east (Matt. 2:12), and Pilate's wife (27:19).

To Joseph "the Lord appeared in a dream," and gave him instructions regarding the infant Jesus (Matt. 1:20; 2:12, 13, 19). In a vision of the night a "man of Macedonia" stood before Paul and said, "Come over into Macedonia and help us" (Acts 16:9; see also 18:9; 27:23).

## **Joseph in the Pit**

Here we see Joseph at the age of seventeen, the favorite son of his father Israel. You would think that if anyone new about how children felt when parents played favorites it would be Jacob. He must have remembered how he felt when Esau was his father's favorite, and he now must see in the faces of his sons just how much they were jealous of Jacob, especially when he received his coat of many colors and just how much they hated him. What do you think, maybe it was Jacob's great love for Rachel, that kept Joseph as his favorite.

And now it's as if adding fuel to the fire. Joseph has a dream "For, behold, we were binding sheaves in the field, and, lo, my sheaf arose, and also stood upright; and, behold, your sheaves stood round about, and made obeisance to my sheaf." And his brothers hated him even more, and the thought of Joseph ruling over them.

Joseph has another dream, "Behold, I have dreamed a dream more; and, behold, the sun and the moon and the eleven stars made obeisance to me. Is-

rael rebuked Him but the Bible says "his father observed the saying. It reminds me in a way of Mary when it says, "She pondered all these things in her heart."

Joseph's brothers were out in the fields at Shechem feeding the flocks, when Jacob approached Joseph and asked Him to go to see how his brothers were. Joseph couldn't find them in Shechem, and at the advice of someone there went to Dothan to look for his brothers. They notice Joseph coming from a distance, and they began to plan a way to get rid of Joseph, even to kill him. The oldest brother Rueben convinced them not to kill Joseph, but rather to place him in a pit. So they stripped Joseph of his coat of many colors, and cast him into the pit. Then they sat down to eat, and while they were eating, they saw a company of Ishmeelites coming from Gilead with camels loaded for trading. They decided to spare Joseph's life, lifted him out of the pit and sold him to the Ishmeelites for twenty pieces of silver.

As you go forward with other lessons, watch Joseph's life, and what seems like a bad thing now becomes a good thing later, as God fulfills His perfect plan for Joseph, and for you and me.
